Samuel Arregoces is from the village of Tabaco, a community of small-scale farmers of African descent which was brutally evicted in 2001 to make way for expansion of the massive Cerrejon opencast coal mine, now jointly owned by

UK mining companies Anglo American, BHP Billiton and Glencore. (Speaking in Stirling and Glasgow)



Gilberto Torres is a former trade unionist with Union Sindical Obrera, representing workers in the oil industry. He was abducted and tortured by paramilitaries in 1992 and now lives in exile. Gilberto believes his abduction was ordered and assisted by Ocensa, a joint venture... ...pipeline company part-owned and operated by BP. (Speaking in Edinburgh)



Danilo Urrea, CENSAT/Friends of the Earth Colombia, has investigated the social and environmental impacts of the massive Cerrejon mine, including its recent diversion of a river to expand the site, and campaigns to reform the Colombian governments mining policies. (Speaking in Stirling and Glasgow)



Francisco Ramirez Cuellar is a trade unionist and lawyer with the Colombian Unified Trade Union Federation. He has been targeted and threatened because of his legal and campaigning work challenging environmental and human right abuses in Colombia. (Speaking in Edinburgh)
